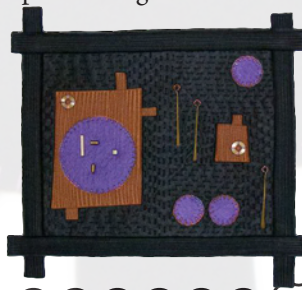

100 Calorie Summer Treat! Frozen Chocolate- Covered Bananas

No need to overdo it on a loaded
banana split sundae. These chocolaty
banana pops are the perfect frozen
treat to satisfy your craving.



To make: Peel 4 large ripe bananas,
cut in thirds and insert a popsicle
stick into a cut end of each piece.
Melt 3/4 cup semisweet or bittersweet
chocolate chips. Cover each piece of
banana with melted chocolate and
sprinkle with coconut. Place on a
baking sheet lined with parchment or
wax paper and freeze for 2 hours.
